

Bird Sightings along Latchmore Stream from Ogdens car park to the beginning of Alderhill Inclosure.

The birds reported are recorded sightings and events related to the birds from 2011-2015.

77 species are recorded to date along Latchmore stream. 15 red, 24 amber, 33 green. (British Birds of Conservation Concern) and 5 birds of no conservation concern.

Some of the birds recorded along the Latchmore corridor are highly endangered, or declining and in danger of extinction,

The wide variety of shrubs, trees, gorse and brambles that still remains either side of parts of the stream, the banks themselves and the ground cover of the heather and reeds along Latchmore Brook make this area very special for a wide variety of bird species.
